Description

The TPS6287B25EVM-024 EVM can be used to evaluate the TPS6287Bx device family. The TPS6287Bx is a high-frequency, synchronous stepdown converter, designed for a small design size and high efficiency. The device focuses on highefficiency, step-down conversion over a wide output current range. At medium to heavy loads, the converter operates in PWM mode and can enter *power save mode* operation at light load to maintain high efficiency over the entire load-current range. The device is available in a 4.05mm × 3.05mm, 24-pin VQFN package.



1 Evaluation Module Overview

1.1 Introduction

This user's guide describes the characteristics, operation, and use of TI's evaluation module (EVM) for the TPS6287Bx devices. The TPS6287B25EVM-024 is designed to help the user easily evaluate and test the operation and functionality of the TPS6287Bx buck converters. The TPS6287B25EVM-024 can be used to evaluate the TPS6287B10, TPS6287B15, TPS6287B20, TPS6287B25, and TPS6287B30 devices. The EVM converts 2.7-V to 6.0-V input voltage to a regulated 0.4-V output voltage. The output current can go up to 25-A for the TPS6287B25EVM-024. This user's guide includes setup instructions for the hardware, a printed-circuit board (PCB) layout, a schematic diagram, and a bill of materials (BOM).

The TPS6287B25EVM-024 facilitates the use of TPS6287Bx device family. Thus, the individual specifications varies with end user selected DUT. Please refer to *TPS6287Bxx 2.7V to 6V Input, 10A,15A, 20A, 25A, and 30A Fast Transient, Synchronous Step-Down Converter With I²C Interface data sheet for more information on device specifications.*

1.4 Device Information

The purpose of the TPS6287B25EVM-024 is to support the evaluation of the TPS6287Bx device family. The TPS6287B10, TPS6287B15, TPS6287B20, TPS6287B25, and TPS6287B30 are a family of pin-to-pin 10-A,15-A, 20-A, 25-A, 30-A synchronous step-down DC/DC converters with I²C interface and differential remote sense. All devices offer high efficiency and ease of use. The devices can operate in stacked mode to deliver higher output currents or to spread the power dissipation across multiple devices.

The I²C-compatible interface offers several control, monitoring and warning features, such as voltage monitoring and temperature related warnings. Devices can operate in power-save mode for maximum efficiency, or forced-PWM mode for best transient performance and lowest output voltage ripple. The default start-up voltage is resistor selectable through the VSET1 and VSET2 pins. Please refer to *TPS6287Bxx 2.7V to 6V Input, 10A, 15A, 20A, 25A, and 30A Fast Transient, Synchronous Step-Down Converter With I²C Interface data sheet for more information.*

2 Hardware

2.1 Hardware Setup

This section describes how to correctly use the TPS6287B25EVM-024.

2.1.1 Connector Descriptions

MH1 - VIN	Positive input voltage connection from the input supply for the EVM.
J1 – VINsense, J2 – GNDsense	Input voltage sense connections, measure the input voltage at this point.
MH2 – GND	Input return connection from the input supply for the EVM.
MH3 – VOUT	Positive output voltage connection.
J3 – VOUTsense, J2 - GNDsense	Output voltage sense connections, measure the output voltage at this point.
MH4 – GND	Output return connection.
JP1 – EN	EN pin jumper. Place the supplied jumper across ON and EN to turn on the IC. Place the jumper across OFF and EN to turn off the IC.
JP2 – MODE/SYNC	MODE/SYNC pin jumper. Place the supplied jumper across VIN and MODE/SYNC to force the device in fixed frequency PWM operation at all load currents. Place the jumper across MODE/SYNC and GND to enable power save mode. Connect a clock signal to MODE/SYNC referenced to GND to synchronize the switching frequency to the clock signal.
J5 – PG	The PG output appears on pin 1 of this header with a convenient ground on pin 2.
J7 – SYNC_OUT	At the SYNC_OUT output, the switching frequency is provided at pin 1 with a convenient ground on pin 2.
J6 – I ² C	I ² C connection configured for being used with the USB2ANY interface.

2.1.2 Setup

To operate the EVM, set jumpers J3 and J4 to the desired positions per *Section 2.1.1*. Connect the input supply to MH1 and MH2, between VIN and GND, and connect the load to MH3 and MH4 between VOUT and GND.

To evaluate the I²C features a USB2ANY interface can be connected to J6. For this interface, a software GUI is available here.

3 Implementation Results

3.1 Performance Specification

This section provides a summary of the TPS6287B25EVM-024 performance specifications.

3.2 TPS6287B25EVM-024 Test Results

The TPS6287B25EVM-024 was used to take the typical characteristics data in the TPS6287Bx data sheet. See the *TPS6287Bxx 2.7V to 6V Input, 10A,15A, 20A, 25A, and 30A Fast Transient, Synchronous Step-Down Converter With I*²*C Interface* data sheet for the performance of this EVM.

3.3 Modifications

The printed-circuit board (PCB) for this EVM is designed to accommodate the different output current versions of this integrated circuit (IC). On the EVM, additional output capacitors can be added, the default output voltage can be changed using VSET1 and VSET2 pins.

3.3.1 Input and Output Capacitors

Footprints for additional input capacitors and additional output capacitors are provided. These capacitors are not required for proper operation, but can be used to reduce the input and output voltage ripple and to improve the load transient response. For proper operation, the total output capacitance must remain within the recommended range described in the *TPS6287Bxx 2.7V to 6V Input, 10A,15A, 20A, 25A, and 30A Fast Transient, Synchronous Step-Down Converter With I²C Interface data sheet.*

3.3.2 Output Voltage Setting

The output voltage of U1 is set to a default of 0.75 V. Other default voltages can be set using appropriate values for the resistors R3, R4, R5, and R6 to set VSET 1 and VSET2. During operation, the output voltage can be changed using the I²C interface. For more details, see the *TPS6287Bxx 2.7V to 6V Input, 10A,15A, 20A, 25A, and 30A Fast Transient, Synchronous Step-Down Converter With I²C Interface data sheet.*

3.3.3 Control Loop Compensation

C46, C47, and R1 are used for compensating the control loop. If the output capacitors have changed, adjustments of the component values in the compensation network can be necessary. For more details, see the *TPS6287Bxx 2.7V to 6V Input, 10A,15A, 20A, 25A, and 30A Fast Transient, Synchronous Step-Down Converter With I*²*C Interface* data sheet.

3.3.4 I²C Interface

Output voltage, output voltage ramp time, soft-start time, and various control features can be controlled through the I²C interface. IC status information is also available. For more details, see the *TPS6287Bxx 2.7V to 6V Input, 10A,15A, 20A, 25A, and 30A Fast Transient, Synchronous Step-Down Converter With I²C Interface data sheet.*



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


Figure 4-2. Top Silk






Figure 4-6. Layer 4





Figure 4-8. Layer 6



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


Figure 4-10. Bottom Layer
